I would like to thank the school for organizing a fun yet meaningful day for the students. I hope for more such events to make school life much more meaningful and joyful.












NATIONAL DAY

OVERSEAS LEARNING JOURNEY

16 AUGUST 2023

Two groups of three teachers and ten Secondary 3 East Springians went on a four-day, three-night overseas learning journey to learn about STEM education and industries. The students were selected through a rigorous process.

One group visited Hanoi, the capital of Vietnam. In Hanoi, the group visited various historical and cultural sites such as the Hoa Lo prison, Temple of Literature, Train Street, Hoan Kiem Lake, St. Joseph's Church, the Old Quarters, and a Water Puppet show at the Thang Long Theatre. The group also visited the Bac Ninh Vietnam-Singapore Industrial Park (VSIP). The students gained insights into the park's beginnings and how the park remains sustainable. They also visited other companies such as FPT Hanoi, Honda Vietnam, and TEKY Academy. FPT is one of the largest information technology service companies in Vietnam, and TEKY Academy is where students can learn fundamental skills required in STEM professions such as coding, programming and robotics.

The other group visited Ho Chi Minh City, named after Vietnam's founding father. The group visited the Cu Chi Tunnels, a vast network of underground passageways used by Viet Cong soldiers during the Vietnam War. The group also visited the Binh Duong VSIP in Ho Chi Minh City and learned about how the VSIP is managed. They also visited the Yakult factory in the VSIP.

Overall, both groups learnt about how Vietnam industrialised and became a rising powerhouse in Asia and the world. The learning journeys were eye-opening and left a lasting mark on the students' perspectives. The experiences have instilled in the students the values of empathy and resilience, which align with our school values.

28 AUGUST 2023


